ARE WE REALLY "A KINGDOM OF PRIESTS"?

In Peter's first letter, he tells us that we are "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that (we) may declare the praises of Him who called (us) out of darkness into His wonderful light" (1 Peter 2:9). He is talking to followers of Jesus Christ and many of the descriptive terms he used come directly from Old Testament passages relating to the nation of Israel.

God called them (beginning with Abraham) out to be "a kingdom of priests" for the purpose of interceding for the rest of the world and for sharing the message of God with the non-Jewish people. However, they failed to do so, becoming self-centered and proud of their "position," and rather than sharing God's love, they became prejudiced against those who were not from their "chosen" nation!

Most Christians pass judgment on the Israelites for having such an attitude toward the outside world. But we should stop and ask ourselves, if perhaps we haven't developed a very similar perspective today. Are we really living as "a kingdom of priests," or are we cloistered within our church houses, judgmental and prejudiced toward all non-church members and anyone who isn't following God the way we are, and we fail to realize that God has called us to show mercy, grace and love toward all those who need Him!

Jesus told a parable about the man often referred to as the "rich fool" (Luke 12:16-21). He tore down his barns to build bigger ones when they could not contain his harvest, but he was not generous toward God. Let me ask a question from a different perspective: Would empty barns (church houses)—due to apathy and complacency of "sowers and harvesters"—be any less a sin than that of the man who tore down his barns to build bigger ones?

You see, being busy around your church house very likely does little to fulfill the calling and gifting of God to be "a kingdom of priests" or to make disciples of our lost world! Let's be who God calls us to be, so that we may gain a reputation that's more about loving God supremely and loving others as we love ourselves—rather than being known for what—and who— we are against!
