Thank you to the missionaries who came. Thank you to Stephen Jumper and Shara Cowen who tirelessly labored on behalf of International Commission. And thank you to our participating churches, volunteers and pastors who grasped the concept and rolled up their shirt sleeves to labor alongside of each other, that's my opinion and I am sticking to it.

Mountain Top 243

From April 19-25, 2024, 28 volunteer missionaries from the states of Texas, North Carolina, Missouri and Oklahoma assembled in Granbury and Glen Rose, Texas to work with 12 churches in the Paluxy Baptist Association to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The core process is called Operation Andrew (OA). With OA, church members write down the names of non-believers to pray for them, engage with them, invite them and share the Gospel with them.

The Holy Spirit showed up in a big way. Going out in 6 days of ministry in Hood and Somerville County with local churches, 243 made first time professions of faith (also 2 baptisms, 20 rededications and over 1349 people heard the Gospel). What an amazing experience to live out the Great Commission and see the Lord answer so many prayers.

If you have ever been on a short-term mission trip, then you know the spiritual "mountain top" experience it can be. As I traveled back on April 25 to my home in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, I was full of the Holy Spirit, felt so close to God and simply was on the "mountain top." Having been on mission trips both domestically and internationally, I knew the spiritual experience wouldn't and couldn't last.

When Peter experienced the transfiguration, he simply wanted to stay on the mountain top by building shelters for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. Seeing the Lord and these two greatest prophets transfigured, Peter had to be filled with the greatest joy ever, and one could even say, he was as close to heaven on earth as possible. But Jesus brought the disciples down the mountain where everyday life occurred. They couldn't stay on the mountain top. They had to go back to their work in the valley and maybe even bring some of that light on the mountain down into the valleys where darkness and sin reside.

Is it possible that we are supposed to bring this same light into the darkness of people's lives simply by carrying out the Great Commission? Do we really understand that there are lost, non-believing and hurting people in the world who need the love of Jesus and to hear the Good News of the Gospel?

The Paluxy Baptist Association has been working in partnership with International Commission (IC) for more than 10 months to prepare for this work. And now through the hard work and dedication of so many, the PBA and IC are taking the next step in designating the association as an Operation Andrew Designated Association. This means that the PBA will be taking the lead next year in working with the Palo Pinto Baptist Association and the Parker Baptist Association to prepare for a bigger, broader partnership involving many more churches and volunteers.
